What You Need to Know.....

- COVID-19 vaccination is recommended if you are pregnant, breastfeeding, trying to get pregnant now, or might become pregnant in the future.
- You may receive a COVID-19 vaccine booster shot while you are pregnant.
- Evidence about the safety and effectiveness of COVID-19 vaccination during pregnancy has been growing. This suggests that the benefits of receiving
- a COVID-19 vaccine outweigh any known or potential risks of vaccination during pregnancy.
- If you are pregnant or recently pregnant you are more likely to get severely ill with COVID-19 compared with people who are not pregnant.
- Getting a COVID-19 vaccine can help protect you from severe illness from COVID-19.
